

The Biology 12 Program focuses on <u>HUMAN BIOLOGY</u>, allowing students to develop an interest in and an understanding of science by looking at themselves and seeing how the diverse body systems are integrated to maintain homeostasis. The learning outcomes follow a sequence from cell structure and simple, biochemical processes to the organ systems themselves. The learning outcomes are categorized under three curriculum organizers; cell biology, cell processes/applications and human biology.

When communication between teacher/student or student/student (such as during instruction, labs or group work) is required listening to an IPOD is not allowed and will result in the same consequences as using a cell phone in class.
